

WHY IS THE RSLN IMPORTANT?

Evangelicalism currently has an incoherent relationship with Roman Catholicism. Many evangelicals are uncertain about what Roman Catholics actually believe. Do they believe in the same Gospel, or something entirely different? This question is important for leaders of evangelical churches and organizations and for hundreds of millions of evangelical believers around the world. We are convinced, in line with the historic Protestant view, that Roman Catholicism is a severely flawed system in need of a radical biblical reformation in its basic theology and practice.

Currently, the Reformanda Initiative is the only organization with a strategy and program for evangelical leaders and scholars to study Roman Catholicism from an explicitly evangelical perspective so that they may equip and educate others as well.

RSLN VISION

The Rome Scholars & Leaders Network was designed to create a context for evangelical scholars and leaders:


- To have access to evangelical scholars who are experts on Roman Catholicism.
- To study and evaluate Roman Catholic theology and practice in the heart of Roman Catholicism, Rome itself.
- To be trained and equipped to be scholars, leaders and communicators of an evangelical perspective about Roman Catholicism and the biblical Gospel of salvation through faith alone.



WHO CAN ATTEND?

The Rome Scholars & Leaders Network is invitation only. The RSLN would welcome applications from:

- 1. Evangelicals scholars currently involved in theological research and/or training
- 2. Existing or emerging evangelical scholars or leaders with at least a Master in a theological field
- 3. Influential evangelical leaders and trainers serving in, or preparing others for service in a Roman Catholic context



WHAT IS THE RSLN?

The RSLN is a weeklong seminar in Rome sponsored by the Reformanda Initiative, partner of the Forum of Christian Leaders (foclonline.org).

The Rome Scholars & Leaders Network programme includes:

- 1. **Text-based discussions** on pre-assigned reading selections
- 2. **Integrated lectures** on Roman Catholic theology and practice, evangelical theological distinctives, historical relations between Roman Catholics and Protestants, and opportunities for dialogue, evangelism, and engagement today
- 3. **Papers**, written and submitted by participants, from an evangelical perspective on Roman Catholic theology and practice that are evaluated by Rome Scholars faculty
- 4. **Personal mentoring** between each participant and a faculty member
- 5. **Excursions and tours** of the Vatican and other important historical sites in Rome

LEONARDO DE CHIRICO

Dr. Leonardo De Chirico is the pastor of Breccia di Roma. His PhD is from King's College (London); it was published as Evangelical Theological Perspectives on Post-Vatican II Roman Catholicism. His latest book is Same Words, Different Worlds. Do evangelicals and Roman Catholics believe the same gospel? recently published by IVP. He is a lecturer of Historical Theology at Istituto di Formazione Evangelica e Documentazione in Padova, Italy. Additionally, Leonardo is the Director of the Reformanda Initiative / RSLN.



GAVIN ORTLUND

Dr. Gavin Ortlund is a pastor, author, speaker, and apologist for the Christian faith. He serves as the senior pastor of First Baptist Church of Ojai in Ojai, California. Gavin has a Ph.D. from Fuller Theological Seminary in historical theology, and an M.Div from Covenant Theological Seminary. He is the author of eight books as well as numerous academic and popular articles. He runs the YouTube channel Truth Unites, which seeks to promote gospel assurance through theological depth.



GREGG ALLISON

Dr. Gregg Allison is professor of Christian theology at the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. Gregg received his PhD at Trinity Evangelical Divinity School. He is secretary of the Evangelical Theological Society and a book review editor for the Journal of the Evangelical Theological Society. He is the author of numerous books, including Roman Catholic Theology and Practice: An Evangelical Assessment (2014), Historical Theology: An Introduction to Christian Doctrine (2011) and 40 Questions about Roman Catholicism (2021).



MATTHEW JOHNSTON

Matthew Johnston is a pastor of Lux Evangelica, a church he helped plant in Genoa. He has served in Italy since 2013 and previously was an associate pastor in Florida. He is a graduate of The Expositors Seminary (MDiv, 2011) and the University of Glasgow (MTh, 2023), where he researched Christology in the thought of Robert Bellarmine and Francis Turretin. He is working on his PhD in historical theology at ETF, Leuven.



RACHEL CIANO

Rachel Ciano lectures in Christianity in History at Sydney Missionary and Bible College, Australia. With her husband, she has ministered in Australia and the UK. In 2009, they planted a church in a multicultural area of Sydney which is one-third Catholic, and they continue to serve and lead here. She is co-author of 10 Dead Guys You Should Know, and the apt sequel, 10 Dead Gals You Should Know.



LAUREN MOORE

Lauren Moore is a missionary and church-planter in France. She has earned degrees in Christian Ministry (Ridley College, Melbourne, Australia), and in Philosophy: Religions and Societies (University of Bordeaux Montaigne, France).
